# Samarkand State University

## 1. Information about the university.

The history of Samarkand State University goes back to the origins of the madrasah that appeared on the territory of our country from the 9th century and the madrasah founded by our great-grandfather Mirzo Ulugbek. An ancient institution of higher education in Samarkand - a madrasah, founded by Mirzo Ulugbek and started in 1420, operated until the 20s of the 20th century, and Samarkand State University began its activities in the second half of the 20s.

On August 10, 1926, the 103rd protocol of the meeting of the Council of People's Commissars of Uzbekistan decided to establish a higher educational institution in Samarkand. The current Samarkand State University, established under the name of the Higher Pedagogical Institute, was inaugurated on January 22, 1927. Since January 22, 1930, the Higher Pedagogical Institute has been called the State Pedagogical Academy of Uzbekistan, and in connection with its reorganization, it was transferred to the faculty system. In March 1941, the faculty of pedagogy was reorganized and named the State University of Uzbekistan (UzSU), and in connection with the 500th anniversary of the birth of Alisher Navoi, the university was named after him. During the Great Patriotic War (from November 1941 to October 1944), UzSU acted as part of the Central Asian State University (now the National University of Uzbekistan) and was restored by the decision of the government of Uzbekistan on February 25, 1944. By decision of the government of Uzbekistan in May 1960, UzSU was renamed into Samarkand State University (SamSU).

In the 2020/2021 academic year, **5,292 students were admitted to the undergraduate program**, **2,140 students** to the correspondence department , **434** students to the evening department , **513 students to the master's program (including 1,132** under the state grant for undergraduate studies) **(21.4%)** , distance learning - **30 (1.4%)** , for evening education - **3 (0.7%)** , for a master's degree - **193 (37.6%)** ).

**174 students** were admitted to the Faculty of International Educational Programs. **380 students were admitted** to the correspondence department (in the second specialty) on a paid-contract basis.

students were admitted to the special correspondence department of the bachelor's degree (including **0** under the state grant, **0** on a fee-based contract basis).

### **State of training and retraining at the university.**

Over the past 3 years, **638** professors and teachers have improved their qualifications (**67.2%**);

**308 educational and methodological complexes have been** prepared, more than 1600 previously existing educational and methodological complexes in subjects have been filled; The number of university employees who defended their thesis in the last 3 years (47 in 2018, **56** in 2019, **59** in 2020).

### **9. The international cooperation.**

The University has the right to participate in international cooperation in the field of higher and postgraduate education of the Republic of Uzbekistan in the following order:

- in accordance with the decision of the University Council to establish direct relations with the relevant higher educational institutions and organizations of foreign countries, conclude cooperation agreements with them, conclude agreements on the issuance of bilateral diplomas, create faculties and branches in cooperation in the manner prescribed by law;
- participation in bilateral exchange programs with foreign students, researchers, teachers and researchers, admission to study in the areas of education;
- assist the scientific and pedagogical staff of the university in conducting joint scientific research, as well as in organizing international conferences, symposiums, training seminars and other scientific and cultural events;

- assistance in the implementation of fundamental and applied scientific research, as well as experimental design work on orders from foreign legal entities;
- participation in international programs for improving higher and postgraduate professional education.
- attraction of funds and investments from international funds and organizations in cooperation with researchers of the university teaching staff, assistance in the preparation of joint projects in cooperation with foreign higher educational institutions and organizations;
- invitation of the faculty and research staff of foreign higher educational institutions to conduct lectures, seminars and educational trainings at the university.

### **11. Material and technical base of the university.**

The total area of educational and laboratory facilities is **23972 sq.m.**

The area per student is **2.2 sq.m.**

The number of educational halls is **344**, (enough to conduct the educational process in just **2** shifts).

Laboratory audiences - **61**, language laboratories - **2** (92% of laboratory equipment).

The number of computer classes - **27**, the number of computers - **1485**, at the rate of 1 computer for 8 students. The number of computers connected to the Internet - **1050**. The number of technically faulty and obsolete computers is **53**.

The number of student dormitories is **6**, the number of places is **1560** (3860 people need accommodation, of which 1149 are women). Also, **1,789** students live on rent in private apartments.

Nutrition complexes for students: the number of canteens - **8** (for 1000 places); number of buffets - **1** (110 seats).

Sports complexes: the number of indoor halls - **4**, the number of outdoor areas - **2**.

### **12. Financial condition.**

The allocated budget is **52988.0** million soums. Extra-budgetary funds amounted to **160685.8** million soums. Investments **0.0** million soums. Foreign investment \$0. Sponsorship amounted to **276** million soums.

The total amount of expenses for the educational process in 2020 amounted to **5,580,600** soums (including **90,000** thousand soums for updating the fund of the Information Resource Center; **1,740,200,000** soums for educational laboratory equipment, **1,764,400,000** soums for the purchase of computers; **1,873,700** soums for the purchase of furniture, 112,300 soums for paying for Internet services).
